10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

*St Mary's Anglican Church and Graveyard*, an Old Colonial Norman Revival church with stone walls and a shingled roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

- it includes one of the oldest churches and graveyards in the State;
- the place is associated with the founding and development of the townsite of Busselton;
- the place has close connections with the founding families of Busselton, such as the Bussells and the Molloyes, who not only raised the funds for its construction, but actively helped to build it;
- the place demonstrates a high aesthetic value;

it is highly valued by the local community in its own right and as a house of worship; and,

its long history and association with the founding families of Busselton contribute to the community's sense of place.
