10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Ye Olde Narrogin Inne, a double storey brick and tile hotel in the Inter-War Old English style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is situated on a site which has been continuously used as a hotel since at least 1856, and has been important to the Western

Australian community as one of the early stopping places for coaches, and as a venue for socialisation by the local community and travellers from 1856 to the present;

the place is an outstanding and rare example of a building constructed in the Inter-War Old English style, enhanced by consistent stylistic detailing;

the place is a widely recognised landmark building on the South Western Highway; and,

the place was designed by architects Eustace Cohen, John B. Fitzhardinge and Joseph Eales of long standing firm Eales & Cohen.
