10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Toodyay Redhill Convict Road Station Ruins, a once-substantial establishment built of mud bricks to house convict work crews, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is one of only a very limited number of clearly identified convict sites of this type, and at present is the only road station to have been adequately surveyed;

the place is historically associated with the convict system, and with the Royal Engineers and convict road gangs who constructed and maintained the important road link between Perth and Toodyay;

the place contains the structural remains of a convict road station and will provide valuable archaeological information on the construction of adobe walls; and,

the place has social value to those Western Australians who acknowledge and celebrate convict ancestry.
