10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Dominican Convent Chapel of St Hyacinth (fmr), an Inter-War Romanesque style masonry chapel with a terra cotta tiled roof and adjacent masonry and timber framed bell tower, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place was designed by the Priest/Architect John Cyril Hawes;

the place is the smallest of Hawes' church designs and the place contains significant examples of Hawes' 'hand-made' arts and crafts influenced artwork;

the place was constructed by local builder Hendry Cutton Jermy, whose work as a carpenter and builder is significant in the Yalgoo area;

the place is associated with the Dominican Sisters who made extensive and valued teaching and religious contributions in Yalgoo and the Midwest;

the place contributes to the Yalgoo community's sense of place; and,

the place is an unusual and sophisticated building which is a landmark in the Yalgoo Region.
