10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Melangata, an Inter-War Romanesque style masonry station homestead with a corrugated galvanised iron roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has a close association with the Priest and Architect John Cyril Hawes, and also with the local builder Hendry Cutton Jermy. The place is the only private design of Hawes' built in Western Australia; and one of Hawes' very few domestic works world-wide;

the place is associated with prominent local families, the Williamsons and the Seamans;

the place contributes to the Yalgoo community's sense of place; and,
the place is an unusual and sophisticated building of climatically
responsive design which is a landmark in the Yalgoo Region.

Associated structures connected with the working environment on
Melangata station are not included in this assessment.
