10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*First Church of Christ, Scientist, Perth*, an ashlar ruled stucco finished masonry church building with a corrugated iron roof, designed in the Inter-War Art Deco style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a very fine and rare example of the Inter-War Art Deco style applied to a church building;

the place is a landmark in the procession of buildings leading into the City from the west and from the terrace of Parliament House;

the place is one of most notable modern public buildings designed and built in Western Australia in the Inter-War period and exemplifies

the aspirations and achievements of the small church congregation;  
and,

the place is a very good example of design by the well known  
architectural firm of Ochiltree and Hargrave.

The garden setting, car parking area and Sunday School building to the  
north of the Church, together with the toilet additions to the Church itself, are  
of little cultural heritage significance.
