10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Fremantle Esplanade Hotel, comprising a rendered and painted limestone rubble walled and brick building with a timber verandah and a custom orb corrugated iron roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has historical associations as it has been in continual use since early European settlement of Western Australia, and these uses reflect the Colonial, the 1890's Gold Boom and the 1980's Americas Cup periods of development in Fremantle; and, the place has value for its stylistic qualities in design and detailing, and is a landmark in Fremantle.

The coolroom at the north corner of the building is considered to be of no significance. The internal layout of the place has been subject to major alterations, many of which may be considered intrusive, but their removal may not necessarily enhance the cultural heritage significance of the place.
