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## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE.

Perth Town Hall has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the building is a fine example of Victorian Free Gothic architecture;

the building is a rare Australian example of a nineteenth century town hall modelled on those of fourteenth century European market towns;

the focus of civic and social activities since 1870, the place is a prominent Perth landmark;

it is an integral component of the precinct of public buildings associated with nineteenth century colonial administration; and,

the building is closely associated with the State's history of penal transportation.
