10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Mundaring Weir Hall, a single-storey brick and iron hall, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is closely associated with the period when Mundaring Weir was a flourishing community, chiefly made up of workers who were either employed by the Public Works Department to run the two pumping stations or people carrying out tasks that were associated with the pumping stations;

the place has historical associations with the Goldfields pipeline, which enabled many Wheatbelt centres to survive, and continues to support inland mining settlements;

the place is a finely constructed example of a simple Federation Arts and Crafts building, featuring English bond brickwork;

the place is historically associated with the Mechanics' Institute movement; and,

the place is representative of the type of building constructed by local community groups to serve as their Institute Hall. It contributes to a precinct that includes several residences and the Mundaring Weir Hotel, and is held in high esteem by the people of Mundaring and Mundaring Weir.
