10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*Anglican Church of the Annunciation*, a timber framed, Federation Carpenter Gothic style structure, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a fine example of Federation Carpenter Gothic architecture;

the place was the centre for the North West Diocese 1910-1964 and the Pro-Cathedral for the north-west, the spiritual and administrative centre for the area; and,

the place is closely associated with Bishops Trower, Frewer and Witt, who each made a great contribution to the people of the north-west.

An associated free-standing belfry on a metal framed tower is situated on the north side of the church, on part of the common property of an adjoining strata development, and has cultural heritage significance but is not included in this assessment.
