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### 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The ruins of *Lynton Convict Hiring Depot* have cultural heritage significance for the following:

the place is a rare and important example of a convict hiring depot in Western Australia;

the place is a reminder of the convict era in Western Australia, demonstrating the role of convict depots and ticket-of-leave men in the development of rural infrastructure: the place demonstrates the results of working with limited materials and human resources in an isolated environment;

the place is illustrative of the efforts of the colonial government to encourage the settlement of the Port Gregory area;

the place is a dominant feature of the landscape, having a landmark quality; and,

the place has scientific value as a research site.
