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## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Bowes, comprising a cement rendered, brick walled, corrugated iron roofed homestead and associated formal garden and trees, a cement rendered, brick walled and corrugated iron roofed kitchen, a cellar and a metal clad laundry and butchery, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place was the first pastoral and agricultural property in the Northampton District and was a model for the development of subsequent properties in the area. As such it is highly representative of a phase of agricultural development of the State and the Northampton District;

the place has a close association with the Burges family who developed the area, in particular with William Burges, who was a magistrate in the region;

the place has aesthetic value as a unified group of farm buildings set in the landscape and forming a picturesque composition;

the place makes a contribution to the community's sense of place; and, the place has rarity as a relatively complete example of its type.
