10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Masonic Temple, a single-storey Federation Academic Classical style brick building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place makes a contribution to the streetscape with its moulded exterior enhanced by its central porch;
 - the place is closely associated with the rapid population growth in the eastern goldfields at the turn-of-the-century;
 - the place is an expression of community wealth and prominence;
 - and,

from the day of its opening the place has been held in high regard by the local Masonic fraternity.

A timber framed and corrugated-iron clad caretakers quarters at the rear of the site is considered to have little heritage value.
