10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Windsor Hotel has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is representative of the Australian pub tradition as a twostorey hotel with verandahs, located on a prominent street corner;

the place is a fine example of Federation Filigree Style;

the place is a landmark in the townscape of South Perth;

the place is closely associated with the early development of suburban housing south of the river in the late 1890s; and,

the place is a fine example of the commercial architecture of J.J. Talbot Hobbs, one of Perth's prominent architects of the 1890s. The later additions to *Windsor Hotel* on both the Mill Point Road and Mends Street elevations are considered to be of low cultural heritage significance.
