10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Masonic Lodge, a single-storey Federation Academic Classical style building of pink-coloured sandstone, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place makes a valuable contribution to the streetscape with its strongly modelled exterior, created by its central porch and classical stucco mouldings, and its pink sandstone walls; and,

the place is closely associated with the presence and activities of Masons amongst the rapidly expanding population of the eastern goldfields at the turn-of-the-century.

A timber framed and ripple-iron clad, single-storey caretaker's residence situated adjacent to the lodge, and in poor condition, is considered to have low heritage significance.
