10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Brooklands, a single-storey, Victorian Regency style, brick and corrugated iron farmhouse, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a handsome and well proportioned building of high aesthetic value which, by its setting, contributes to the landscape;

the place is significant in demonstrating the development of agriculture in the South-West region;

the place is important for its association with pioneers, explorers and politicians in Western Australia such as Walter Padbury, William Spencer, Norman Baxter and particularly Charles Brockman, and therefore contributes to the wider local community's sense of place; and,

the place is highly valued by the religious community based on the property for its association with the establishment of their commune at Balingup.
