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## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

House, 2 Hill Terrace, Mosman Park, a large brick and terracotta tile residence in the Inter-War Old English architectural style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a fine example of the Inter-War Old English architectural style applied to a residence, demonstrating a skilled level of design excellence in its massing, its use of materials and the high quality of its interior decoration,

including half-timber ceilings, exposed brick walls, ornate timber doors and decorative brick fireplaces;

the place was designed by Edwin/Reginald Summerhayes, one of the state's most prominent architects in the inter-war period;

the place demonstrates the development of Mosman Park from a working class to affluent town, with architect-designed homes sited along river views.

The garage to the east of the site is of little heritage significance.
