10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE  
*St Luke's Church, Cemetery and Belfry* comprising a stone and shingle (now covered with iron) church and free standing timber framed belfry (1861, 1969), graveyard (c. 1853-1903), and cypress trees, is of cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
  - the place was the first purpose-built place of worship in Gingin;
  - the place has a close association with European settlers of the Gingin district, some of whom are buried in the graveyard;
  - the place is historically important as an example of a nineteenth century Anglican Parish Church, dating from the 1860s, set in a graveyard dating from the 1850s;

the place contributes to the community's sense of place as a reminder of the mid-nineteenth century development of the Gingin district and the role of religion in that development; and, the place provides a picturesque silhouette in its graveyard setting, which is enhanced by the mature cypress trees and the free standing belfry.
