10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

East Perth Primary School (fmr) comprising the Main Building, (circa 1895 to post 1914), constructed in brick with a terra cotta tile roof, and the Infants School Building (fmr), (pre 1902 to 1914), constructed in brick with pitched

iron clad roof, has cultural heritage significance derived for the following reasons:

the particular vernacular design of the Main Building and the simple, utilitarian design of the Infants School Building (fmr);

the place has historical significance as the government school for the former East Perth residential district;

the place has a close association with Hillson Beasley, the Government Architect;

the place is socially significant because of its association with families of a former residential quarter of the city; and,

the place is representative of a Government School dating from the turn of the century.
