3. DESCRIPTION OF ELEMENTS INCLUDED IN THE ENTRY (GENERAL)

Completed in 1855 this shingle roofed single storey limestone building in a Victorian Tudor style with Dutch gables, was designed by William Sanford and constructed utilising convict labour. Additions were carried out in 1910 by the Public Works Department.

7. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE OF PLACE (ASSESSMENT IN DETAIL)

The place has been assessed by the National Trust of Australia (WA) and has been entered in the Register held by that body as a classified building with the following statement of significance:

Interesting example of the Colonial style of architecture of the 1850s using local stone and with characteristic detail of the Dutch gable. Historically is an important educational landmark of the period, through which passed many boys who later played a prominent role in WA development. Restored and now in use for Perth Institute of Film and Television.

The place has also been assessed by the Australian Heritage Commission and has been entered in the Register of the National Estate with the following statement of significance:

Interesting example of the colonial style of architecture of the 1850s using local stone and with characteristic detail of the Dutch Gable. Historically is an important educational landmark of the period through which passed many boys who later played a prominent role in WA development. Recently retored and currently occupied by Perth Institute of Film and Television.
